## **Structured Workplace Learning (SWL)**

Structured Workplace Learning funding is provided to 31 Local Learning and Employment Networks (LLEN's) across Victoria to increase access to appropriate SWL placements for students undertaking VET as part of their senior secondary certificates.

The program aims to open up more opportunities for young people aged 15 – 19 years of age to improve their skills and workplace knowledge through 'on the job' experience whether it be via Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) or School Based Apprenticeships/Traineeships (SBAT'S).

Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) is where a student is actively participating in a workplace as a component of a formal Vocational Education Training (VET) enrolment. Students are generally studying in years 11 or 12 and undertake a SWL placement for one day a week or in blocks of one week at a time.

An SWL work placement provides students with access to facilities, equipment and the range of work necessary to develop and consolidate their skills to the level required by the course/qualification.

SWL enables students to gain specific skills on-the job or in a simulated workplace environment. The placement must be directly related to the specific units of competency/skill requirements of a VET course/qualification. The school and participating employers agree on these skills or competencies prior to the placement.

## What is a School Based Apprenticeship and Traineeship (SBAT)?

SBAT's are a fantastic opportunity for students to work as a part time paid trainee or apprentice whilst completing their secondary education at school. SbAT's are a great way to learn nationally recognised job skills in a chosen career. They provide vast career prospects and provide the opportunity to complete secondary school with two certificates. Students must be at least 15 years of age to be a school based apprentice or trainee.

#### **Statewide Online SWL Portal:**

The Department of Education and Training (DET) has invested in the development of an online portal. It has been designed to advertise Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) opportunities, allowing senior secondary students to search for opportunities that match their location and course of study.

#### WHAT IS THE FUTURE SELF PROJECT ABOUT?

The Future Self Program will promote future career aspirations and pathways to schools and students through connections with local business and Industry Ambassadors. Students will gain a greater understanding of the careers and opportunities across different industries and sectors within Gippsland. Ambassadors will undertake a range of different school engagement activities such as class presentations, Q&A sessions, workplace tours, and supporting a student on work placement.

#### WHAT IS A FUTURE SELF AMBASSADOR?

Future Self Ambassadors are volunteers who are passionate about their careers, their organisation or their roles. They volunteer their time and support to promote their career to students in a vast range of original, creative and practical ways. Future Self Ambassadors not only inspire young people; they may also support teachers in the classroom by providing an insight for their students into careers and industry in their local area. The Future Self Ambassadors program enables, business, organisations and individuals wanting to support students to explore future careers and pathways in a way that will deliver the best results for them and young people.

#### **HOW DO SCHOOLS PARTICIPATE?**

- Schools / Students can see list of Future Self Ambassadors on the Future Self page via the Baw Baw Latrobe LLEN website
- Teachers can then register an expression of interest for an Ambassador by submitting an online request.
- Upon receipt of the expression of interest request from the school, the LLEN will contact the requested Ambassador.

If the Ambassador is able to facilitate the request:

- Secondary Schools Log onto SWL Portal and consume event relating to the Ambassador
- Primary Schools the school will be provided with contact details of the Ambassador
- The Ambassador will connect with the School and arrange requested activity to be undertaken.

#### **Girls in Trades**

The Girls in Trades event will be for all girls currently studying a non-traditional VET trade or have a desire to pursue a non-traditional trade.

The aim of this event is to give female students and their families an insight into how traditionally male dominated trades are evolving and becoming more female friendly.

The event will also provide an opportunity to hear from two guest speakers in the industry and then a panel discussion with other trades including painters, tilers, plumbers, mechanics and builders.

The 'I am Ready Program' is designed to address the current failure of transitioning young people with learning barriers into employment. The social cost of not addressing the current gap is unacceptably high and carries with it significant social consequence and lost opportunity as well as the monetary cost. The structure of the I Am Ready Program initiative allows a holistic approach to address the issue of how to make work real for participants by creating a common language for work readiness across all stakeholders in the partnership. The initiative offers three stages to support innovation and industry connections based on best practices in facilitating youth transitions that fosters empowerment and self-direction.

#### Stage 1: I Am Exploring

Delivering the eight Employability Skills including: Team Building, Industry Buddies & Visits, Mock Interviews, Dressing for Success, Career Pathways Expo.

Stage 2: I Am Becoming Ready - with coordinated assistance participants apply to take part in work experience or traineeship opportunities with engaged employers as a school term of work experience one day a week;

Stage 3: I Am Ready – supporting employers, young people and their families in placements in school based apprenticeships, vocational training and structured workplace learning, and post school employment. Stage 3 includes brokering placements, mentoring in the workplace. Target participants – I Am Ready Partnership will meet the needs of students with disability (and their families) in Years 10–12, enrolled in mainstream and specialist schools across Gippsland – both funded and non-funded for their disabilities.

Following a successful pilot of Project Ready in 2022, Baw Baw Latrobe LLEN (BBLLLEN) will again run Project Ready in 2023. Project Ready is aimed at year 10's with a focus on re-engaging students through a 12 month experiential work readiness and interactive personal development program. The Program will be delivered from Moe Library on Wednesdays and Fridays for the full year- easily accessible by public transport.

#### The program will commence on Wednesday, 8 February 2023 from 9.00am to 3.00pm

Project Ready was first delivered by Central Ranges Local Learning and Employment Network in 2017 to assist disengaged students become re-engaged in their education and ready for their future worlds of work. Since then, Project Ready has been redeveloped to meet the needs of a wider range of students such as those who have not identified a preferred career path or developed the work readiness skills required to successfully transition to further education, training or employment. Project Ready is available as a full-year VET program mapped against Certificate II in Active Volunteering.

BBLLLEN Project Ready program will be delivered by a TAE-qualified trainer (known as the Project Ready facilitator). The facilitator has specialist facilitation skills to enable delivery of the Project Ready curriculum using relationship-based pedagogical approach.
